Introduction to Dakshina Bharat Hindi Prachar Sabha, Chennai

BRIEF INTRODUCTION

Dr. B. D. Jatti Homoeopathic Medical College was started in 1992 with an initial intake of 25 students. Since its takeover by Dakshina Bharat Hindi Prachar Sabha, Dharwad, due to sincere efforts of the Management & Staff, the intake of the college has increased to 100 from the year 2003-04.

The college is housed in an impressive building in the heart of the city in five acres of land in the vicinity of the Central Bus Stand & Railway Station (Just 1km). There are many qualified & highly experienced faculty members on the rolls of the college. The college is permitted by Depts. of AYUSH, Govt. of India & Govt. of Karnataka. Recognized by MARBH & National Commission for Homoeopathy, New Delhi and affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka, Bengaluru. The College attracts students from various states of the country apart from Karnataka.

College Hospital

DISCIPLINE

The College authorities expect every student to maintain discipline and conduct in a manner befitting a future Homoeopathic Doctor. The College lays great stress on the development of character of the students and expects them to behave both inside and outside the college to be worthy of high standard behavior. Courtesy, Kindness and Tolerance are virtues which the student is particularly advised to cultivate. Irregularity in attendance, indifference in regard to class work; discourtesy towards teachers, subordinates, disorderly behavior etc., are punishable. Students should carry identity cards when they go to the Library, Laboratories and Examination Hall. Students are not allowed to play any kind of sports, game etc. with outside teams without Principal's permission.

RAGGING

Ragging - "Causing, inducing, compelling or forcing a student, whether by way of a practical joke or otherwise, to do any act which detracts from human dignity or violates the person or expose him / her to ridicule or forbear from doing any lawful act, by intimidating, wrongfully restraining, wrongfully confining, or injuring him or by using criminal force to him or by holding out to him any threat of such intimidation, wrongful restraint, wrongful confinement, injury or of criminal force" is prohibited in the College campus. It is also liable for prosecution by the Police & Judiciary.

The Supreme Court of India, in the writ petition (Civil) No. 656 of 1968, passed an order in 2001 in which it ordered education institutions that, ragging is banned in the institution and any one indulging in ragging is likely to be punished appropriately. The punishment may include fine with a public apology, suspension from institution or class for a limited period or expulsion from the institution. The punishment may also take the shape of: i) Withholding scholarships or other benefits ii) Debarring from representation in events iii) Withholding results iv) Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess and the like.

B.H.M.S. DEGREE COURSE

The Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (BHMS) Degree course is of Four and a Half years duration plus compulsory internship of One year after passing the Final year examination.

Eligibility For Admission

1. The candidate must have become eligible in the NEET conducted by the Central Govt. for that year.
2. A candidate must have passed the two year PUC examination or any other examination recognized as equivalent, with English as one of the languages and Physics, Chemistry and Biology with 50% aggregate as optional subjects to be eligible for admission to I BHMS Course.
3. A candidate who has passed B.Sc. Part-I degree examination of any University in India or recognized as equivalent with the combination of science subjects namely Chemistry, Botany & Zoology and secured not less than 40% of marks in the aggregate in above mentioned subjects is eligible for admission to BHMS Course, provided the candidate has passed the PUC or equivalent examination with Physics, Chemistry, Biology as optional and English as one of the languages.
4. A candidate who has passed B.Sc. degree examination of any University in India or recognised as equivalent with the following science subjects namely Chemistry, Botany and Zoology and secured not less than 40% of marks in the aggregate in B.Sc. final examination in those subjects is eligible for admission to BHMS Course, provided the candidate has passed PUC or equivalent examination with Physics, Chemistry & Biology as optional and English as one of the languages at the Pre-University or B. Sc. Part-I level.
5. A candidate should have attained the age of 17 years on or before 31st December of the year of his/her admission.
6. The candidates who have passed the qualifying exam other than PUC-II Science of Karnataka State, should obtain Eligibility Certificate issued by the Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences Karnataka, Bengaluru at the time of admission to BHMS Course.

Admission Details

Original records required at the time of admission :

- a) NEET Qualification Rank Card.
- b) Qualifying examination marks card i.e. PUC II year (Science) / Inter II year / 12th standard.
- c) Transfer certificate.
- d) SSLC / 10th standard or equivalent examination marks card.
- e) Passport & stamp size photographs (4 each)
- f) Migration certificate from the concerned Board or University for Non-PUC / Non Karnataka students.
- g) Eligibility certificate from Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka, Bengaluru for Non - PUC / Non-Karnataka students.
- h) A declaration will have to be signed by the student and parent/ guardian at the time of admission in the presence of The Principal/ Admission Committee (Prescribed format will be supplied at the time of admission to the college).

EXAMINATIONS

I. First BHMS Examination : will be held after One year of admission.

Subjects to appear for the Examination:

1. Homoeopathic Pharmacy.
2. Human Anatomy including Histology and Embryology.
3. Physiology including Biochemistry.

II. Second BHMS Examination : will be held after One year of passing the I BHMS Examination.

Subjects to appear for the Examination:

1. Pathology, Microbiology, Bacteriology, Parasitology and Virology.
2. Forensic Medicine & Toxicology.
3. Organon of Medicine & Homoeopathic Philosophy.
4. Homoeopathic Materia Medica.

III. Third BHMS Examination : will be held after One year of passing the II BHMS Examination.

Subjects to appear for the Examination:

1. Surgery including ENT, Ophthalmology, Dentistry, Orthopaedics and Homoeopathic Therapeutics.
2. Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Infant Hygiene and Homoeopathic Therapeutics.
3. Homoeopathic Materia Medica.
4. Organon of Medicine and Homoeopathic Philosophy.

IV. Fourth BHMS Examination : will be held after One and a half years of passing the III BHMS Examination.

Subjects to appear for the Examination:

1. Practice of Medicine including Paediatrics, Psychiatry, Skin Diseases and Homoeopathic Therapeutics.
2. Homoeopathic Materia Medica.
3. Repertory.
4. Community Medicine.
5. Organon of Medicine & Homoeopathic Philosophy.

V. Internship : One Year Compulsory Rotatory Internship after passing the Final year BHMS Examination.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION

A student may be admitted to the respective BHMS Examinations as given above, provided that he/she has regularly attended the course of instruction in the subjects of the Examination, Theoretical and Practical, for the prescribed period of duration with a minimum 75% of attendance separately in Theory/ Practical/ Tutorial/ Seminar to the satisfaction of the institution. Formative Assessment will be held every month. Summative Assessments (Internal Assessment/ Preliminary Examination) will be held at the end of each term. A student must secure atleast 50% of maximum marks fixed for Internal Assessment in a particular subject in order to be eligible to appear in the University Examination, satisfying the regulations of Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka, Bengaluru, failing which he/ she shall not be eligible to appear for the said examination.

Standard of Passing

A candidate to be declared as pass in any subject, shall secure separately in Theory, Practical and Viva Voce Examination with not less than 50% of maximum marks prescribed for the University examination.

Criteria for Passing

To consider as pass in I BHMS , II BHMS , III BHMS and IV BHMS Examinations, a candidate has to pass in all the prescribed subjects of the University Examinations for the concerned year.

No candidate shall be admitted to II BHMS Course unless he/ she has passed in Human Anatomy and Physiology subjects of the I BHMS.

Facility to Keep Term

Not with standing with the foregoing regulations, the students shall be allowed the facility to keep term on the following conditions :

- a) The candidate must pass the subject of Homoeopathic Pharmacy, if failed earlier, atleast one term (6 months) before he/ she is allowed to appear for the II BHMS examination.
- b) The candidate must pass the II BHMS examination atleast one term (6 months) before he/ she is allowed to appear in the III BHMS examination.
- c) The candidate must pass the III BHMS examination atleast one term (6 months) before he/ she is allowed to appear in the IV BHMS examination.

Number of Attempts

If a candidate fails to pass in all the subjects within four chances I BHMS or II BHMS or III BHMS examinations, he/ she shall be required to prosecute a further course of study of all the subjects and in all parts for One year to the satisfaction of the Head of the institution and appear for examination in all the subjects. Provided that if a student appearing for the IV BHMS examination, has only one subject to pass at the end of prescribed chances, he/ she shall be allowed to appear at the next examination in that particular subject and shall complete the examination with this special chance.

Failed Candidates

Candidates who are not eligible to be promoted to the next higher class, shall undergo training in the failed subjects. **For the failed subjects, FAILED SUBJECT TUITION FEES shall be collected from each of such students, for each of the subjects, which he/she has failed.** To become eligible to appear for subsequent supplementary examination, failed students should put in atleast 75% of attendance in this special training.

Admission to the Next Year of the Course

An application in the prescribed form for admission along with Tuition fees to the next year of the course must be made by every student studying in the College as notified.

Compulsory Internship Training

Each candidate shall be required to undergo compulsory rotatory internship of One year, after passing the Final BHMS examination, to the satisfaction of the Principal of the College. The candidate shall be eligible for the award of degree of Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (BHMS) by the University only after successful completion of the Internship.

In the event of shortage or unsatisfactory work, the period of compulsory internship and provisional registration shall be accordingly extended by the college authorities and State Board / Council.

Each candidate shall complete the internship training within a period of 24 months after passing the final year examination.

Discontinuation of the Course

If a regular student of the College wishes to cancel/ discontinue the admission/ course for any reason, in the middle, the student is liable to pay the entire prescribed fees for the remaining period of the course.

Students admitted through Karnataka Examination Authority, Bengaluru/ Govt. of Karnataka are also liable to pay the entire prescribed fees unless he/ she is selected by Karnataka Examination Authority, Bengaluru/ Govt. of Karnataka to some other course, during the same counselling.

Authority

The Head of the institution or his nominees, shall have final authority in deciding and implementing all the above mentioned rules & regulations and any other decisions taken depending upon the prevailing circumstances from time to time. Their decision shall be final and binding.

M. D. (Homoeopathy) - POST GRADUATE DEGREE COURSES

College Offers Post Graduate Degree Course in

1. M. D. (Hom.) in Homoeopathic Materia Medica
2. M. D. (Hom.) in Organon of Medicine & Homoeopathic Philosophy
3. M. D. (Hom.) in Repertory
4. M. D. (Hom.) in Practice of Medicine

The course shall be of Three years duration including One year of house job during which the candidate shall be a resident in the campus and shall receive training.

Eligibility for Admission

1. The candidate must have qualified in the AIAPGET conducted by the Central Govt. for that year.
2. Candidates seeking admission to M.D. (Homoeopathy) should possess the degree of Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (BHMS) or equivalent qualification in Homoeopathy included in the Second Schedule of Central Council of Homoeopathy Act, 1973 after undergoing a course of study of not less than Five years and Six months duration including One year compulsory Internship.

Admission Details

Original records required to be submitted at the time of admission :

- a) AIAPGET qualification rank card.
- b) First to Final BHMS marks card.
- c) Internship Completion Certificate from college previously studied/ worked.
- d) Degree Certificate/ Provisional Degree Certificate.
- e) Registration Certificate from respective Board/ Council.
- f) Attempt Certificate from the college previously studied.
- g) Transfer/ Leaving Certificate from the college previously studied.
- h) Migration Certificate from the concerned University or Board.
- i) Eligibility Certificate from Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka, Bengaluru.
- j) A declaration will have to be signed by the student at the time of admission in the presence of the Principal/ Admission Committee (Prescribed format will be supplied at the time of admission to the College).

Method of Training

The emphasis shall be on in-service training and not on didactic lectures. The candidate should take part in group discussions like seminars, clinical meetings and journal club. The candidate shall be required to write a dissertation with detailed commentary, which would provide with the necessary background of training in research methods and techniques along with the art of writing research papers, learning and making use of library. The candidate shall be in the hospital campus and shall be given graded responsibility in the management and treatment of patients entrusted to his/ her care. He/ She shall participate in teaching and training of under-graduate students or interns.

Attendance

- i) A candidate pursuing M.D. (Homoeopathy) Course shall study in the concerned department of the institution for the entire period as a full time student. No candidate is permitted to work in any laboratory/ college/ industry/ pharmacy etc., while studying Post Graduate course. No candidate should join any other course of study or appear for any other examination conducted by this University or any other University in India or abroad during the period of registration.
- ii) Each year shall be taken as a unit for the purpose of calculating attendance.
- iii) Every student shall attend symposia, seminars, conferences, journal review meetings and lectures during each year as prescribed by the Department/ College/ University and not to remain absent without valid reasons.
- iv) Candidate who has put in a minimum of 75% of attendance in the theory and practical/ clinical assignments separately and shows satisfactory progress, shall be permitted to appear for M. D. (Homoeopathy) Part-I examination.
- v) Candidate who has put in a minimum of 75% of attendance in the theory and practical/ clinical assignments separately and shows satisfactory progress, shall be permitted to appear for M. D. (Homoeopathy) Part-II examination.
- vi) Any student who fails to complete the course in the manner stated above shall not be permitted to appear for the University examinations.

Monitoring Progress of Studies

Every candidate shall maintain a work diary and record of his/ her participation in the training programmes conducted by the department. The work diary shall be scrutinized and certified by the Head of the Department and Head of the Institution.

Synopsis

Every candidate shall submit synopsis in prescribed format containing particulars of proposed dissertation work within Six months from the date of commencement of the course.

Dissertation

- a) Every candidate shall prepare and submit Four printed or typed copies of dissertation, embodying his/ her own research and contribution in advancing the knowledge in the subject, to the University for approval not later than Six months prior to the holding of Part II examination.
- b) The dissertation shall be submitted to the Guide/ Supervisor at least Three months before the time fixed for submitting it to the University and the Guide/ Supervisor shall certify that the work has not previously formed the basis for award of any Post Graduate Degree or Diploma and that the work is the record of the candidate's personal efforts and submitted to the University duly countersigned by the Guide/ Supervisor.
- c) The examiners appointed to conduct the examinations shall scrutinize the dissertation and jointly report whether the dissertation be accepted or rejected or may make suggestions, as they deem fit.
- d) The candidate shall be allowed to appear for the Part-II examination Three months after the examiner has accepted the dissertation.
Provided that the candidate, whose dissertation has not been accepted, may be permitted to resubmit the same within a period of Six months and not more than One year after rejection.

University Examination

The examination shall be conducted in two parts, namely :

- a) M.D. (Hom.) Part I, which is to be held Six months after completion of house job of One year duration.
- b) M.D. (Hom.) Part II, which is to be held after One year and Six months after Part I examination.

Part-I M.D. (Hom.) Examination

Every candidate seeking admission to Part I examination shall submit an application to the University with a certificate from his/ her Guide about the completion of the Part I course of studies in the subject in which the candidate is seeking admission to the examination.

Part-II M.D. (Hom.) Examination

Every candidate seeking admission to the Part II of the examination shall submit an application to the University with the following :

- a) A certificate showing that he/ she has passed Part I examination (at least Six months before scheduled Part II examination)
- b) A certificate from his/ her guide, endorsed by the Head of the Department and the Principal about the completion of studies in the subject in which the candidate is seeking admission to the examination.

Admission to the Next Year

An application in the prescribed form for admission along with fees to the next year must be made by every student studying in the College, as notified.

Criteria for Passing

For declaration of pass in an examination, a candidate shall secure a minimum of 50% marks in Theory, Practical and Viva-Voce separately.

Discontinuation of the Course

If a regular student of the college wishes to cancel/ discontinue the admission/ course for any reason, in the middle, the student is liable to pay the entire prescribed fees for the remaining period of the course also.

Students admitted through the University CET cell are also liable to pay the entire prescribed fees.

Authority

The Head of the Institution/ nominees, shall have final authority in deciding and implementing all the above mentioned rules & regulations and any other decisions taken depending upon the prevailing circumstances from time to time. Their decision shall be final and binding.

THE FATHER OF HOMOEOPATHY

Christian Friedrich Samuel Hahnemann, the founder of Homoeopathy, was born in Germany on 10th April 1755 to an impoverished middle-class family. He was trained and taught by his father never to learn passively but to question everything. By this, Hahnemann later developed his thirst for learning and became proficient at many languages and science subjects.

Hahnemann later undertook study of Medicine, qualified with honours in 1779 and started practicing as a doctor in 1781. He took his calling as a medical healer seriously and applied himself conscientiously to his profession. In these early years as a doctor, using the medicines and techniques available to the profession at the time, he found to his dismay that he was not only not achieving a healing response in many of his patients, but in some cases causing greater damage to the health of the patients through toxic effects of some of the medicines, than the disease, if left untreated, would have caused.

This tragic fact made such a profound moral impression on him, that he felt compelled to withdraw from the profession in order to not to contribute to the harm being committed to humanity in the name of medicine.

Hahnemann then resorted to make a living from writing and translation. While undertaking the translation of a particular medical text, he read the claim that the drug Cinchona (Peruvian bark) was effective in treating the symptoms of malaria because of its bitter taste. But Hahnemann's scientific mind did not accept that claim and he decided to take drug himself in order to establish exactly what effects cinchona did have on the human organism. He discovered that this bark actually created malaria-like symptoms on healthy individual which he reasoned that the similarity of symptoms that somehow produced the healing effect. This prompted the postulation of the first principle of Homoeopathy: "Like cures Like" or stated more precisely: that which can produce a set of symptoms in a healthy individual, can treat a sick individual who is manifesting a similar set of symptoms.

He coined the name "Homoeopathy" to describe this approach to healing, deriving it from the Greek: Homoeos (similar) + Pathos (suffering).

Hahnemann resumed his practice using to full effect his newfound approach to the art of healing. He soon attracted many followers among the physicians of his days and the new science started to spread throughout Europe and abroad. A Homoeopathic medical movement started which eventually spread throughout the Europe and North America and also eastward into Asia, and especially India.

He continued throughout his long career to refine and improve the practice of Homoeopathy. After a long career as a Medical practitioner, Researcher, Writer and Lecturer, Hahnemann died on 2nd July 1843 at the ripe age of 88 years in Paris.

The fruits of Hahnemann's genius continue to benefit us today in ever increasing measure as the efficacy and safety of Homoeopathy in the treatment of countless disease states becomes evident to many people.
